In relation to the top priority

1. Parking issues reported and attended by PCSO BRAIDLEY and to be monitored. Recently officers from the RPG have been carrying out static speed camera checks and using the ANPR ( Automatic Number Plate Recognition ) at various locations along the A170 and Racecourse Road resulting in a substantial amount of fixed penalty tickets being issued and also the seizure of a number of vehicles mainly for no Insurance.

These checks will be continuing.
